17. PUBLIC WORKS/SOLID WASTE (92-14, I, 555 & cont'd to Side II)

Jim Hemminger, Public Works, presented a revised resolution re: disposal of yard waste and forest debris at the Avery Transfer Station. The following three alternatives were proposed: (a) Week-end "Yard Waste Only" Days, and (b) Construction of New Facilities to Collect Yard Waste. Methods of funding were discussed. It was clarified that at the present there is no fee for disposing up to 2 cubic yards, per vehicle, per day. Discussion followed with a suggestion re: possibility of the addition of a surcharge on District 3 property owners to cover costs for the Avery Transfer Station project. Chairman Dell'Orto announced the noticed hearing re: an Appeal filed by John L. Martino regarding a denial of a septic system permit on property located at 488 Mauna Kea, Blue Lake Springs Subdivision. Ray Waller, Building Official, explained that the lot is within 200 ft. of the lake and the law requires a minimum setback of 200 ft. The hearing was then opened for public testimony and Marian Martino informed the Board that a variance was granted in 1983, pursuant to Resolution 83-378, prior to their purchase of the property. Alan Armstrong, Agent, stated that John Martino did not proceed with plans to build until 1988 and was not told of any time constraints. The public hearing was closed and the matter returned to staff for comment. Waller indicated that Building will have to look at Armstrong's original plans since the resolution was based on those plans when the variance was granted in 1983. A standard system is being proposed and the project needs to be re-visited to make sure that every-thing will pass due to the lapse of time.

Motion was made to uphold and reaffirm action taken by the Board in 1983 granting a variance from the 200 ft. setback requirements on APN 26-032-33, with the stipulation that the project will be brought up to current standards and requirements.

24. APPEAL/PLANNING/PUBLIC HEARING/ZONING (92-14B, I, 1, cont'd to Side II)

Chairman Dell'Orto announced the noticed public hearing regarding an APPEAL filed by Lucy Tryon and Ellie Kern concerning Planning Commission's decisions of Feb. 6, 1992 re: Zoning Amendment 90-54 and Conditional Use Permit 91-40 for Louis and Margaret Jensen. The project is also known as Jensen's Pick & Shovel and involves a proposed campground and recreational activities on property located on the eastern side of Parrotts Ferry Road about 1/2 mile south of Maning Cave Rd. near Vallecito. Susan Larson, Acting Planning Director, submitted staff's report and comments. It was announced of interest. All those intending to testify were asked to stand and be sworn in by the Clerk. Michael Arkin, Attorney for the appellants, submitted his written comments to Ms. Larson and she read his letter into the record. It was noted that the question of boundaries of Jensen's property is now in the courts. Ellie Kern, appellant, stressed her concerns re: need for good planning, possible allowance of motorcycles on the grounds the need for fencing all around the project and noise problems.

Bruce

Borad, Attorney for Jensens, referred to a letter from Attorney's Ginter, etal, then stated that motorcycles are not an issue, they are not being considered by the applicant. He further stated that there is not need for an EIR and addressed the noise issue. Borad then informed the Board of proposed rules for the use of park and addressed concers re: fencing and the boundary line dispute. The following people supported the appeal:

Jeanine Taylor, Mary Peters and Bob Kern. Those supporting the project were Steve Fairchild and a Mr. Nesler. Arkin and Kern then submitted the appellants' summary reiterating the need for control of trespass problems.

Borad indicated that the applicant is in agreement with fencing the facility stating that the present fence line is not the property boundary line.

Acting Planning Director presented staff's summation stating that motorcycles are not a permitted use and the use of helicopters was not considered during the Planning Commission's hearing. She then reviewed those issues addressed in the appeal letter. Supervisor Gordon stated that he feels the fence should only be required around the area where recreation is being planned (10 acres). Mrs. Jensen interjected that they have provided for a buffer area between their property and the neighbors.

Motion was made to deny the appeal and uphold the Planning Commission's decisions regarding Zoning Amendment 90-54, with a Negative Declaration, and Conditional Use Permit 91-40, for Margaret and Louis Jensen, with the understanding that the applicant will comply with the requirements of the noise element of the General Plan.

25. APPEAL/PLANNING/PUBLIC HEARING/SUBDIVISIONS (92-14B, II, 381 and cont'd to 92-14C, 14D and 14E)

4:05 p.m. : Chairman Dell'Orto announced the noticed public hearing re: an Appeal filed by John Eckland concerning the Planning Commission's action of Feb. 6, 1992 requiring an EIR on the Avery Woods project. Susan Larson, Acting Planning Director, submitted staff's report and comments. The hearing was then opened for public testimony and all those wishing to speak were asked to stand and be sworn in by the Clerk. John Eckland submitted his appeal indicating that he has submitted an Environmental Assessment of the project and has worked with the school district to mitigate school impacts, and has addressed concerns dealing with the Road Dept. and traffic, CalTrans, etc. An archeological study is part of the Environmental Assessment, as well as wetlands, endangered plant species, fish & wild-

life concerns, etc. Gene Weatherby of Weatherby & Reynolds, Consultant Engineers, was

present for comments and they were the people who prepared the Environmental Assessment. He stated that the following concerns were addressed at the Planning Commission hearing: animal habitat, Arnold Treatment Plant, issuance of Negative Declaration vs an EIR, etc. Persons speaking in support of a Negative Declaration on the project were: Clarence Hartley, Mike Skenfield, Julian Williams, Gregory Slazas, Michelle Young, Steve Sanzeri, Robert ? (Manager of Safari Mobilehome Park), Cary Kewish, Carl Self, Debbie Sellick, Loren Ziegler, Phil Rafferty, Steve ?, Matt Brewer, Mark Russell, Dave Spinks, Brian Blurton, Larry Bovigan (sp.?), Dorris Seward, John Freneck, Carl Smith, Steven Satler, Ron Broglio, Guy Meyers, Norm Kestner, Kelly Gibbens and Loren Satler. Those in support of an EIR were: Richard Grasseti for Mountain Alliance, Mrt Lichtman, Ben Gumpertz, Bob Gilbert, Barbara Revines, Bob Kelso, Mary Wheeler, Jim Koch, Steve Elias for Foothill Conservancy, Wendy Corpening, Marney Voorhees and Don Revines. Bruce Borad, representing the Bondini's, submitted their concerns re: access. Judith Cunningham addressed archeological studies. Jerry Johnson, Civil Engineer, spoke regarding a prepared traffic study. Tom Manning spoke regarding Vallecito Union School District's agreement with the developer with regard to mitigation of school impacts. Steve Felte, Manager of CCWD informed the Board of recent studies in the area indicating that the Arnold Sewer Plant has the capacity to take in the Avery area. Dick Weinkle, District 3 Director for CCWD, spoke re: costs for a sewer system for Avery. There being no other persons wishing to testify the appellant, Mr. Eckland, made his summation emphasizing the need for sewers for the schools, the Ridge Crest project, Avery Woods and existing residences and businesses. He further stated that they will be maintaining 80 acres of open space with the golf course. Gene Weatherby addressed mitigation of traffic concerns, sewer concerns, archeological concerns, etc. The public hearing was then closed and the matter returned to the Board and staff for summation and deliberations. Chairman Dell'Orto Negative Declaration and 92 letters are in favor of an EIR. Supervisor Gordon indicated that he has several concerns with the Environmental Study then determined that the project has not been circulated through the State Clearinghouse. He feels that the traffic study and archeological studies are incomplete and inadequate and there is a need for modification to the schools agreement. Gordon feels that the Environmental Study could be used to develop an EIR and satisfy the need for public review and input. He also spoke regarding compliance with proposed CC&R's then referred to the staff re: one year monitoring, etc. Discussion followed.

Motion was made to grant the appeal and refer the project back to Planning for preparation and circulation of a Negative Declaration with 9 additional requirements as follows:

1. The developer shall establish a special district for roads, lighting, and snow plowing.
2. The subdivision, if gated, will not be subject to dedication of the roads to the public, with the exception of Lots 93-103.
3. A separate entrance will be constructed for access to the commercial parking lot extending from the public roadway extending from Hwy 4 and the cul-de-sac for Sequoia Woods Dr. shall extend

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to the southern boundary of the subdivision abutting APN's 30-015-18, 19 and providing a minimum 60 ft. right-of-way at the boundary line.

4. Water monitoring reports, and any other monitoring reports, shall be submitted to State Offices and County Planning Dept.

5. The subdivision map shall denote minimum lot frontages as shown on the tentative map for Lots 7B, 8 and 9A and public access to Lot 8, subject to the approval of Public Works and Ebbetts Pass Fire.
6. The agreement between Vallecito Union School District and the developer shall be modified to include transfer responsibilities to the third party.
7. All zoning shall have a PD-X overlay.
8. The developer shall provide a performance bond to insure grading/erosion control, and to address environmental issues, at an amount to be determined by the Planning Dept.
9. Along with improvements to Sheep Ranch Road, the developer shall provide and install a pedestrian pathway from Avery Woods Drive to Hwy 4, subject to Public Works specifications.
