

An ordinance fixing a bounty on coyote scalps, providing for the presentation of claims therefor and the payment thereof.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Calaveras State of California, do ordain as follows:

Section 1: Any person who shall hereafter kill and destroy any coyote or coyotes, within the corporate limits of the said County of Calaveras, shall be paid a bounty of two dollars out of the general fund in the County Treasury of the County of Calaveras for each coyote so destroyed.

Section 2. Any person who shall kill and destroy a coyote as provided in the last section, may go before the County Clerk or any member of the Board of Supervisors of the said County of Calaveras, and present the scalp containing the ears and nose of the coyote, destroyed, to such officer, and make and subscribe to an affidavit showing the time and place where and manner in which said coyote was killed, which scalp and affidavit, together with a claim for said bounty shall be deposited with the County Clerk of said Calaveras County.

Section 3. The Board of Supervisors shall after passing upon any claim for bounty, cause the scalp or scalps accompanying the same, to be destroyed by fire.

Section 4. No bounty shall be paid unless the claim is presented therefor in the manner provided in this ordinance, within thirty days after the coyote is killed, and no one except the person killing such coyote shall be entitled to present a claim therefor.

Section 5. This ordinance before taking effect shall be published for one week in the Calaveras Chronicle a newspaper published in said Calaveras County and shall take effect and be in force from and after the 17th day of September, 1900.
