Ordinance No. 109

Granting to Harry S. Blood the Franchise, right, privilege, and permission to maintain as a Toll road, and to collect, receive and take toll on that certain public highway situated in the County of Calaveras, State of California, commonly known as and called the "Big Tree and Carson Valley Toll Road," situated and being in said County of Calaveras, commencing about one mile south of the Big Trees, in said Calaveras County, and thence running in the easterly direction to the county line of Alpine County, being about twenty five miles in length, for the period of Twelve (12) years from and after the date of this ordinance.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Calaveras, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby found by this Board and declared that the expense necessary to operate and maintain that certain public highway commonly known as and called the "Big Tree and Carson Valley Toll Road," situated and being in said County of Calaveras, commencing about one mile south of the Big Trees, in said Calaveras County, and thence running in an easterly direction to the County line of Alpine County, being about twenty five miles in length, as a free public highway, is so great to justify the County of Calaveras in so operating or maintaining the same.

Section 2. Harry S. Blood of Calaveras County, California his heirs or assigns, are hereby granted the franchise, right, privilege and permission to maintain as a toll road, and to collect, receive and take toll on that certain road and highway situated in the County of Calaveras, State of California, commonly known as and called the "Big Tree and Carson Valley Toll Road," situated and being in said County of Calaveras, commencing about one mile south of the Big Trees, in said Calaveras County, and thence running in an easterly direction to the county line of Alpine County, being about twenty five miles in length.

Section 3. That the rates of tolls that may be collected

on said road by said Harvey S. Blood under this license and franchise, shall be fixed and regulated each year at the first regular meeting of this Board in the month of May of each year, excepting that the tolls for the year 1901 shall be fixed during the month of July 1901.

Section 4. The license, franchise, permission, privilege and right to collect tolls upon said public highway is hereby granted to the said Harvey S. Blood upon the express condition attached thereto, that the said road shall be kept in reasonable repair by the said Harvey S. Blood his heirs or assigns, during the continuance and term of said franchise.

Section 5. The place on said road where a toll gate shall be located under this license and franchise, is hereby fixed at the public house known as "Gardners" on said road, about two miles easterly from the Big Trees, and the said Harvey S. Blood is hereby authorized to erect and maintain a toll gate at said place under this license and franchise: that the right is hereby reserved to the Board of Supervisors to change said toll gate, or to erect such other toll gates along said road as shall be deemed proper or necessary by the Board of Supervisors of Calaveras County.

Section 6. The franchise, right, privilege and permission hereby granted, is granted to said Harvey S. Blood for the term of Twelve (12) years from and after the date of this ordinance.

Section 7. The said Harvey S. Blood grantee of this franchise, shall file with the County Clerk of the County of Calaveras, the office Clerk of the Board of Supervisors thereof, within Thirty (30) days after the date of the passage of this ordinance, his written acceptance of this ordinance, and of all the provisions thereof.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force fifteen (15) days from and after the date of its passage.

An Ordinance To Repeal Ordinance
No. 19 and 60 Passed By the Board of Supervisors
of Calaveras County.The Board of Supervisors of the County of Calaveras
do ordain as follows:Section 1. Ordinance No. 19 as passed and approved
by the Board of Supervisors of Calaveras County on
April 6, 1887, is hereby repealed.Section 2. Ordinance No. 60 as passed and approved
by the Board of Supervisors of Calaveras County on
October 15, 1894, is hereby repealed.Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and
be in force from and including the 15th day of
March, A. D. 1902, and before taking effect shall
be published in one week in the "Calaveras Citizen"
a newspaper published and printed in said
County of Calaveras.Section 4. The foregoing Ordinance was passed
and adopted by the Board of Supervisors of said
County of Calaveras at a regular session of said
Board on this the 4th day of February, A. D.
